GENERAL PURPOSE

Performs construction, repair and maintenance of overhead and underground power system, requiring the use of precautionary work methods and safety equipment due to electrical hazards present when working on or near energized conductors and electrical accessories.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (Performs Some or All of The Following)

- Installs, removes, maintains, and repairs poles, service lines, transformers, meters, and metering equipment.
- Installs and maintains underground and overhead distribution and transmission systems.
- Handles emergency calls such as power line failures, lines down and other emergencies which may arise during or after hours.
- Operates light or heavy equipment associated with the job.
- Supervises, directs, plans and works with small line crews as needed.
- Instructs and trains Apprentice Linemen in all phases of overhead and underground work performed by a Journeyman Lineman
- Keep track of inventory and materials for jobs

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

1. Education and Experience:

- A. Completion of a certified apprenticeship in Journeyman Lineman and hold a current lineman card

And

- B. Class A CDL, and a knowledge of linework, overhead and underground power systems with various voltages

C. Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Competence in using hand tools or machines necessary to perform the job.
- The ability to read blueprints, mapping and drawings of the items to be made or repaired, and

- visualize the finished product.
- Knowledge of computer operating systems such as Microsoft and company specific software for linemen applications
- Ability to communicate with crews, the public, customers, and coworkers verbally, in person, on the phone, and via electronic methods.

Work Environment:

Tasks require constant walking, bending, stooping, climbing and driving from site to site daily. Conditions will range from extreme heat, dust, weeds, debris in the summer to extreme cold, rain, mud, snow and ice in the winter. Regular exposure to hazardous terrain, trenches, hillsides, etc. Personnel may encounter inquisitive or irate citizens, locked or fenced locations, and encounter hazards such as high voltage electrical equipment or menacing animals, rodents, pests, dogs, etc. Must work in the public right-of-way and associated road hazards. Must be able to work at various heights over 50 feet. Mental application utilizes memory for details, emotional stability and discriminating thinking and creative problem solving. Periodic travel required in course of performing portions of job functions.
